## Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance

Chairman Blair called the meeting of the Ohio Lottery Commission to order at 12:00 p.m.

#### Approval of Meeting Minutes

Commissioner Sweeney moved to approve the September 11, 2024, meeting minutes. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Mingo and was affirmatively voted upon by the Commissioners present.

## Audit Committee Update

Audit Committee Chair Mingo provided an update on the September Audit Committee Meeting. Commissioner Mingo stated that the items of note were the review and approval of the Fiscal Year 2024 Annual Report, the review of the draft governance documents, including the Audit Committee Charter, Internal Audit Charter and Internal Audit Policy Manual. Commissioner Mingo informed the Commission that over the past year included the completion of ten (10) audit projects and the implementation of nine (9) issue recommendations that will enhance controls and improve operational efficiency within the Lottery. Commissioner Mingo reported that results of the recently completed Sports Gaming Proprietor Oversight audit had been reviewed. The purpose of this engagement was to

#### Director's Update

Director Gillcrist reported that the Lottery's transfer to the Lottery Profit's Education Fund (LPEF) for the month of September was \$115.1 million. This is \$2 million lower than profits generated last year. Fiscal Year to date, we have transferred \$387.6 million to the LPEF. Ms. Gillcrist reminded the Commissioners that the Lottery's commitment is \$1.44 billion for FY'25.

Ms. Gillcrist welcomed and introduced Vivica Grayson as a new team member to the Ohio Lottery. Ms. Grayson will be working in the Communications department as the Winner Content Coordinator.

Ms. Gillcrist informed the Commission that the All-Agency meeting was held. This meeting allowed all employees to come together, learn about current sales and marketing projects, share best practices, and learned about stress and time management strategies. Ms. Gillcrist also informed the Commission that the Sales Staff gathered the day prior to learn about sales strategies for the upcoming calendar year and new games that are going to be released. Additionally, a Security presentation was held to train the staff on safety precautions that they can implement while on their daily sales routes.

Lastly, Director Gillcrist shared the 2024 Batchy Advertising award that was won at the North American Association of State & Provincial Lotteries (NASPL) Conference. The Lottery won the award for its Responsible Gambling Communications TV spot "Facemelter." Ms. Gillcrist then invited Deputy Director of Marketing, Tom Ackerman, to provide a brief overview of the TV spot.

# Resolution to Approve thirty (30) new Video Lottery Terminal (VLT) Game Themes

Daniel Carter, Chief Legal Counsel, presented a Resolution to approve thirty (30) VLT game themes.

Chairman Blair moved to approve the Resolution with thirty (30) VLT game themes with Commissioner Gupta offering a second to the Motion and the Motion was approved by all Commissioners present.

#### Office of Finance Report

Chief Fiscal Officer Slyman provided the financial update for the month of September. The total traditional lottery games sales for the month of September were \$350.4 million, which is \$10.6 million or 2.9% lower than same period last year. Draw-based game sales were \$159.3 million, which was \$21.3 million or 11.8% lower than last year. Pick 3, 4 and 5 sales were \$61.1 million, down approximately \$2.2 million or 8.4%. In-state lottery game sales were \$6.9 million which resulted in an increase of \$1.2 million or 21.8% compared to last year.

CFO Slyman stated that the multistate game sales were \$27.5 million, down \$12.7 million or 31.6% lower when compared to the same time period last year. CFO Slyman stated that even though the Mega Million jackpot reached \$800 million in September before it was won, it was not enough to offset the sales that were generated by Powerball last fiscal year. Powerball jackpot was at \$420 million and ended the month at \$960 million. Mr. Slyman informed the commission that we are not seeing the same sales as previously seen.

Mr. Slyman reported that Keno sales were at \$48.4 million, down \$3.1 million or 6.1%. Mr. Slyman stated that with the start of the NFL season, it is quite possible that Sports Gaming may have had a negative impact. Scratch-off game sales in September were \$191.2 million, up \$10.7 million or 5.9% higher than last year. Mr. Slyman informed the Commission that we are one of the few lotteries seeing a positive variance in this game category. This is a record month for Scratch-Off games for the month of September. The \$10 games led sales with over \$43.4 million, followed by the \$20 games at \$42.3 million and the \$50 price point at \$33.8 million.

Lastly, Mr. Slyman stated that the VLT revenue for the month of September was \$109.4 million. Of this, \$72.4 million was distributed to the Racinos as commissions earned and \$36.7 million represented revenue for the Ohio Lottery. VLT revenue is up \$4.4 million, or 1.3% compared to the first two months of last year. Total prize expense equaled 67.7% of sales which is a little higher than normal. This is mainly attributable to both Pick 3 and Pick 5 higher than normal prize payouts in September.
